RULES

- Entry Fees** - Halter classes \$20, Performance classes \$10, Stakes classes \$15. Entries will close Thursday, July 31, 2008. No entries will be accepted unless made in writing, signed by the owner or authorized agent and they must be accompanied by entry fees and stall fees. Photocopy of both sides of **current** registration papers must be mailed with entry blank to avoid post entry fees (except on foals of current year). No numbers will be issued **without** photocopy of both sides of registration papers. For **foals of current year**, submit copy of dam's registration papers, sire's name and # and proposed name of registration. Unnamed foals may not be shown. Make checks or money orders payable to Emerald Empire Welsh Pony Society (EEWPS) in US funds. A veterinarian's or doctor's statement is required for refund of entry fees. **Post entry fees** will be charged an additional \$5 per class up to an extra \$25 per pony for the show. **No post entries for halter classes will be allowed after 8:00 pm Thursday. Entries for over fences classes close 6 pm Friday.** Trading classes will be assessed \$5/class. A non-optional office fee of \$3 per equine shown will be assessed. A fee of \$3/registered Welsh & Half-Welsh showing only in WPCSA performance classes or \$6 for halter (or halter & performance) will be assessed for the **WPCSA recording fee**. Any checks returned by the bank for insufficient funds must be made good (including all fees charged to the club by the bank) within 30 days or your name will be printed in the newsletter, you will forfeit all points earned at the show, and all monetary transactions for the following year will need to be by cash, money order, or cashiers check. No bills over \$20 will be changed.
- The person** making the entry and the pony/cob shall be subject to the local rules of the show and the rules of the WPCSA. **The management** reserves the right to divide, combine, cancel or offer another class according to the number of entries (except WPCSA sanctioned classes). A class must consist of three or more entries (except WPCSA sanctioned classes).
- All contestants** must sign the waiver on the entry form; parents or guardians **must** sign for minors.
- Stall fee** 1 night/\$25, 3 nights/\$60, \$20 additional nights, or \$10 per pony haul in fee.
- Trailer fee** of \$10/animal/day will be assessed, to be included with entry fees. No animal may be left overnight in trailers.
- RV Hook-ups** : Contact LCFE directly at 541-926-4314 **Vendors** \$25 per each 12'x12' space.
- All classes are limited to **Registered Welsh**, all sections, and **Registered Half-Welsh**. All registered Welsh and half-Welsh must be registered with either the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America or a recognized foreign registry (however, national points will not count on foreign registered animals). In order for points to count for WPCSA National or Regional awards: owners of entries in all WPCSA classes must be WPCSA members; and owner listed on entry form and show results must correspond with owner listed on WPCSA certificate of registration.
- Measurement of ponies** - All Welsh ponies and cobs age 6 and over must either be in possession of a WPCSA or USEF permanent measurement card or be measured before being shown in either breed or performance classes. All performance animals under 6 must either be in possession of a completed WPCSA measurement form or an USEF temporary measurement card or be measured by two show officials. Exhibitors who are not members of the WPCSA must pay a \$5 fee per measurement. (Providing false membership information will invalidate the measurement form and any points earned at the show in addition to incurring a \$25 fine). Equines may be measured Thursday 6-9 PM, Friday & Saturday 6:30-8 AM, and Sunday 7-8 AM. If necessary another time may be arranged through the show office.
- Competitors** and handlers must be neatly attired at all times when in the show ring. Western classes must be appropriately attired with Western hat or protective headgear (need not be of Western type); boots; long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar; men are required to wear neckties, kerchief or bolo tie; trousers or pants; (a 1-piece equitation suit is acceptable provided it consists of a collar, cuffs, and buttons or snaps). A belt is to be worn under pant loops. Chaps, shotgun chaps or chinks and spurs are optional. A vest, jacket, coat and/or sweater may be worn. The sidesaddle ride must wear an apron of closed or button type with a belt under any loops. English classes must be appropriately attired in jacket, shirt, hat, boots and breeches or pants.
- Ribbons** to 5 places and to Champion & Reserve, Grand Champion & Reserve, Supreme Champion & Reserve. Equitation classes will have ribbons to 6 places.

11. **Stake/purse classes** will have a \$15 entry fee. \$25 purse classes will have the money split \$15/10 between 1st and 2nd places. Ribbons will be awarded. There must be a minimum of three entries in the class or the money will not be awarded. To be **eligible** for a stake/purse class a pony/cob must have been judged in at least one qualifying class.
12. **WPCSA Division Championships** shall be awarded in the following performance divisions: Welsh English Pleasure A/B Jr; Welsh English Pleasure A/B Sr; Welsh English Pleasure C/D Jr/Sr; Welsh English Pleasure Half-Welsh Jr/Sr; Welsh Western Pleasure A/B Sr; Welsh Western Pleasure A/B Jr; Welsh Western Pleasure C/D Jr/Sr; Welsh Western Pleasure Half-Welsh Jr/Sr; Welsh Pleasure Driving A/B Jr/Sr; Welsh Pleasure Driving C/D Jr/Sr ; Welsh Carriage Driving A/B/C/D/Half-Welsh Jr/Sr; Welsh Hunter A/B Sr; Welsh Hunter A/B Jr; Welsh Hunter C/D Jr/Sr; and Welsh Hunter Half-Welsh Jr/Sr. All three classes in the division must be held for the championship to be awarded. A class must have 3 or more exhibitors for championship points to be awarded. Ribbons will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each division.
13. **Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.**
14. **Delay of Classes:** When the start of any class requiring animals to be show individually is delayed by animals not ready to perform, the competition may be closed at the order of the judge or Show Committee, providing a warning is issued and exhibitors are given three (3) minutes to appear at the in-gate ready to participate. Exception: Hunter/Jumper classes where a specific jump order is given. In classes where animals are shown collectively, a warning is given and the in-gate must be closed two (2) minutes after the first animal entered the ring.
15. **Pleasure & obstacle** driving to be shown to a suitable 2-wheeled or 4-wheeled vehicle, not a viceroy, racing sulky, or Fine Harness rig. Pleasure driving may have a passenger. Wire-wheeled vehicles are permissible.
16. **Junior drivers under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult (18 & over) capable of rendering assistance.** Headers are allowed in all driving classes. Headers and passengers should be appropriately attired.
17. **Mares** will be allowed in the arena with foals in yearling and under halter classes (or champion halter classes if eligible) only at the discretion of the judges.
18. **Rowfantina Gold Coin Memorial Class:** Ponies/cobs with Rowfantina Gold Coin on their papers are eligible for this class. A perpetual trophy is awarded.
19. **The length of toe** and weight of shoe shall be as specified in the WPCSA rules. Unshod ponies may be shown; foals and yearlings in hand classes must be unshod. Disqualification shall be as specified in the WPCSA rules book.
20. **Leadline and Walk/Trot Trail** classes will consist of 4-5 simple obstacles. The course is to be ridden at a walk and optional trot/jog. The class will be judged on the rider's ability to guide the animal through the obstacles 25% and the pony/cobs performance in negotiating the obstacles 75%. There will be no penalty for not jogging/trotting. The same restrictions on entering other classes will apply.
21. **Hunter courses:** Once the course has been set Friday evening, the arena will be closed to **all** competitors. Competitors may walk the course from 7-7:30 Saturday morning. Two practice jumps will be available in the warm-up arena.
22. **Exhibitors are warned** that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials of this show on the part of the owner, lessee, agent, trainer, groom, rider, driver, or handler will disqualify the pony from adjudication. The management reserves the right to remove a pony or cob, owner, lessee, agent, trainer, groom, rider, driver, or handler from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.
23. **Junior** exhibitors are 17 years & under; **Senior** exhibitors are 18 & over. Exhibitor's age is figured as of December 1st of current show year. Please include the date of birth (DOB) of juniors on the entry form. (WPCSA show year is Dec 1 to Nov 30.)
24. **Junior exhibitors are encouraged to wear protective headgear when riding/driving animals on the show grounds.** It is strongly recommended that adult exhibitors wear protective headgear.
25. **Novice Rider/Driver** classes are open to riders who have not won three blue ribbons in that classification. **Novice pony/cob** classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh that have not won three blue ribbons in that classification.
26. **Open classes** are for registered Welsh all sections, and registered Half Welsh. Parents should note that open classes may have animals over 14.2 h in them and exercise judgment in allowing smaller or less experienced children enter.

27. **Oregon** is a state that requires a negative **Coggins test** on all ponies entering the state, except from Washington.
28. **Judge's decision is final.** Protests are to be made to the Show Management in writing accompanied by \$50 fee. WPCSA procedures will be followed.
29. Stallions are to be handled by a responsible person. **Unruly animals will be excused whether stallion, mare or gelding.**
30. **No parking** of vehicles or trailers in the fire lanes around the barns and arena will be allowed except for loading/unloading.

Emerald Empire Welsh Pony Society, the show management, or owners of the show grounds will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to person, ponies, or property. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury or damage caused by his/her pony or by any pony owned by him/her, in his/her charge, or by minors in his/her charge while on the grounds. The exhibitor, by signing the entry form and release, agrees to this paragraph and agrees to indemnify the show management, the Emerald Empire Welsh Pony Society, and owners of the show grounds against all legally established claims or demands of any kind or nature that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any pony or person in his/her charge.

2008 WPCSA CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style, 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes to be judged 100% on performance.

WSPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undo restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners (65%), on breed type, movement and conformation (25%), and appointments (10%). Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown in a suitable two or four wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky, or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, working trot, trot on, and to stand quietly, and except for tandems, to back readily. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRAIGE DRIVING (Article 113.2)

(Wire wheeled vehicles may be used if stated in the prize list) In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1), carriage driving also requires the slow trot which is slower and more collected but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. The animal should indicate a willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence. Turnout to be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire; and 15% on overall impression. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/cones to be judged 100% on performance. Carriage Driving Working Pattern/Test to be judged 60% on execution of test or pattern, 20% on manners and way of going, 20% on condition and fit of harness, vehicle and neatness of attire.

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION (Article 114.1)

Over fences : Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of four fences with eight jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the entire course. The over fences classes must proceed the under saddle class. Under saddle: Division is open to riders 12 years and under mounted on ponies, cobs and half Welsh. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Hunter. Animals must walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2/114.3)

Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Over fences classes to be shown over a minimum of 6 (six) obstacles. To be judged in rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Under saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Tests may be required.

WPCSA STOCK SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2/114.5)

Classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders to be judged on seat, hands, performance of animal, appointments of animal and rider, suitability of animal to rider. Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog and are judged at a flat footed four beat walk, two-beat jog and a three beat lope both ways of the ring. All competitors are required to back a straight line during the line-up. Tests may be required.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1)

Section A, B, C or Half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitor at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. The leading rein to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle and on the Western bridle to the cheek slot of the bit (top of the bit) while leaving control of the pony to the child. No chain leadlines allowed. To be shown on light contact and to be led by an adult. To be shown at a walk, on the right rein, to line up and stand quietly. Ponies will be called out individually to stand, walk out and trot or jog past the judge. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turnout. There are no restrictions on competing in other divisions or classes for the pony or rider. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2)

Section A, B, C and Half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitor at least four, but not more than 10 years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at the walk, and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior aged 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders are ineligible for other classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot poles..

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at the walk and trot. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 and over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders are ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk/trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 and over. Both handler and rider to be suitably attired. English or Western attire

is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders are ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/Half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of the mount. To walk both ways of the ring. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot and walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. Walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders are ineligible for other ridden classes except, costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, and walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 and under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or trot. May be ridden at either the walk or the trot. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders are ineligible for other ridden classes except, costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, and walk-trot.

WPCSA SHOWMANSHIP (Article 115.6)

Classes should be offered for exhibitors 12 and under and 13-17 years of age. Judged on presentation and showman's ability to show his/her pony/cob. 40% of the judging is on neatness and appearance of the showman, pony and tack. 60% will be based on the exhibitor's ability to present his/her pony/cob. A pattern will be posted on hour prior to the class.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SECTION A & B (Article 115.8)**

This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation cit can be re-tacked. UK judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SECTION C & D (Article 115.7)**

This class is for registered Welsh Ponies of Cob Type, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation cit can be re-tacked. UK judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.
